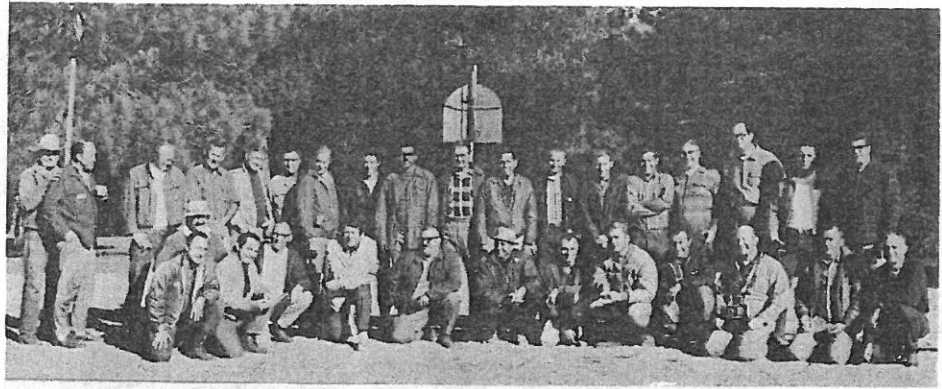

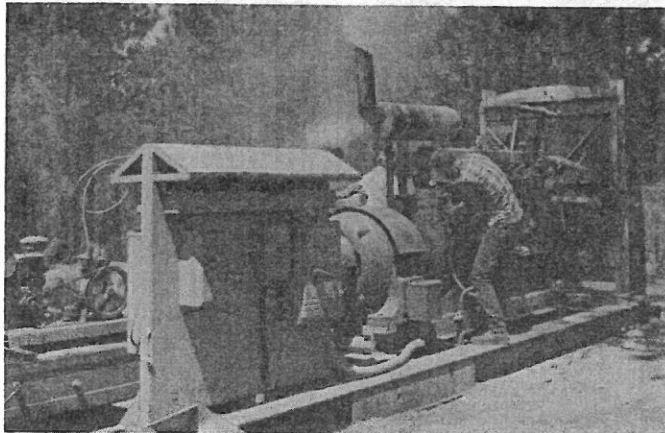

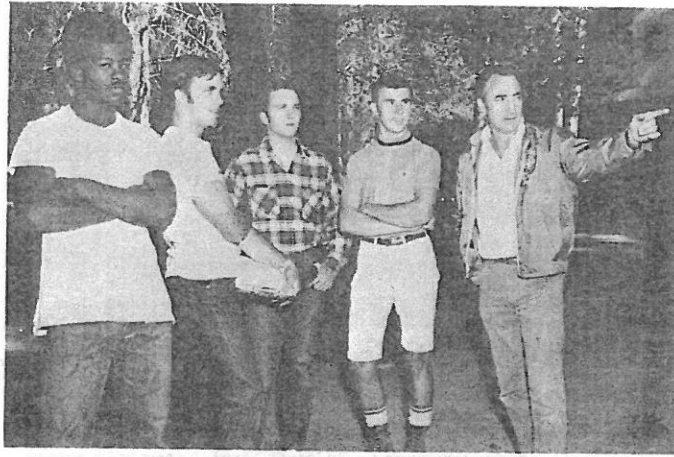
LARGEST OILMAN WORK PARTY

No newsletter unless you write us and tell us what is happening to you. Fair enough? Sending back your form for the reunions does not count as a personal letter.

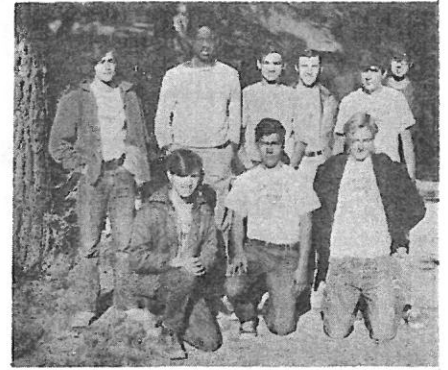

Personal to you from Smokey:

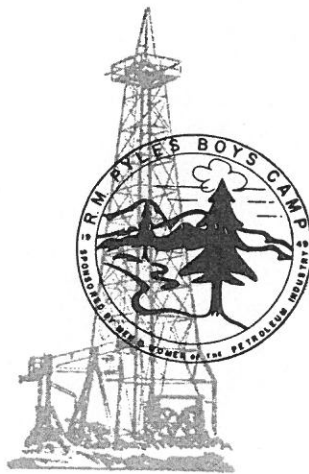
