Most of the time your plan didn't work the first time you tried it. Right? So you had to refine it. You learned from your mistakes. You had to find the lessons in the failed first attempts. Only by learning as you went and adding to your plan were you able to solve the problem and achieve your goal.

What went on at the Ropes Course is a perfect example of how to succeed by setting goals. Do you know where you want to be later on in life? If you don't, I urge you to set some goals for yourself. If you have set some goals, great! Do you know how to reach them? If you don't, then the method you used successfully at the Ropes Course is a great plan to follow. Remember S.T.O.P. to reach your goals.

Pyles "Hot Shot" Crew Fights Fire




BAR-BE-QUE'S COOK FOR CAMP

LION MEADOWS

Lion Meadows is a beautiful place and a special part of R. M. Pyles Boys Camp. Located deep in the Golden Trout Wilderness, Lion Meadows has only a wood-burning stove, a few rustic cabins and some furniture carved from Ponderosa Pines. This is home for select second-year campers called Lioneers.

Unlike the main camp where Nana prepares each meal, or where activities such as archery, horseback, krafts, and ropes course are offered, the Lioneers have to fend for themselves. But for each Lioneer there is a chance to try new and different things. Things that help them grow as a person, but also develop a close-knit family atmosphere. There's a chance to hike to high alpine lakes, play on mountain glaciers, and see magnificent scenery.

This year's Lion Meadows counselors were Amigo, Arrow, Apache, Commando, Dodger, Dolphin, Reckless, and Spuds.

Hermano and Shotgun alternated as program directors.

During outcamp the Lioneers hiked up steep mountains to visit places like Coyote Lakes, Silver Lakes, and even explored some caves near White Chief Lakes. The 5th session crew discovered a new lake between Coyote and Silver Lakes. The new lake is now called "Lioneer Lake" in honor of all the Lioneers.

The Lion Meadows experience is very unique and well worth the effort. Lion Meadows is the next step toward becoming a staff member. The counselors at Lion only recommend the best to return to the main camp and work. Being a worker quali-

fies you for a college scholarship and a chance to become a group counselor.

Unfortunately, the Lion Meadows program can only accommodate a small number of campers. Some of you were recommended to be Lioneers by your counselors. Others, who even though were not recommended, still have a chance. Here's how... write a letter to Rocky or Bravo telling them how you are doing. Are you applying the lessons learned at camp? Did camp really mean a lot to you? If so, let us know. That extra effort can make the difference in being invited back or not!




Bravo was the chief instructor, however, a special word of thanks goes to longtime guest P.L.T. instructors, Tango and Rubi for their expertise.


WORKING STAFF


