
The message for you is that your success is in your hands. Please remember this important lesson and apply it to your life. Be a success because "it is in your hands."

PRESIDENT VISITS WITH PYLES CAMPERS

During third session, the camp received a special honor as the President of the United States paid a visit to the camp area and had lunch by Freeman Creek with Pyles Camp campers and staff. President Bush flew into Public Pasture where he visited briefly with a dozen Pyles Campers. He was then escorted to a grove of Sequoia trees where he hiked with US Forest Service staff. Afterwards campers joined a group of visitors and media to watch the president sign a proclamation which provided greater protection for these ancient trees. After the ceremony he hiked down the Freeman Creek Trail with 15 campers and staff to a quiet lunch site by the stream. During lunch the president talked with these campers about Pyles Camp, their families, and about life in their neighborhoods. They shared their hopes and dreams for the future and told him how the Camp made a positive impact on their lives. The president autographed T-Shirts for those attending the lunch. Once he returned to the helicopters, he shook hands and autographed shirts for the group of boys at the landing zone. The president later wrote us a note to say how much he enjoyed coming to the mountains and meeting all of the boys from Pyles Camp.






FUNDRAISERS

LION MEADOWS

Lion Meadows is an experience unlike any other. It is a time and place away from Pyles Boys Camp, and yet it is Pyles Camp at a different level of intensity. Located deep in the Golden Trout Wilderness, Lion Meadows is just a few rustic cabins, a wood-burning stove, a beautiful meadow, and each other!

At Lion Meadows, Lioneers do the cooking. The prepare their own areas and keep them clean. They bathe in cold mountain creeks, gather firewood, have campfires, sleep out under the stars, and learn to get along with each other in ways they just started to learn in the main camp. For each Lioneer this is a chance to try new and different things that help them grow as a person and develop a close-knit family atmosphere.

Is it worth the experience? You bet! There is a chance to hike to high alpine lakes, play on mountain glaciers, and to see nature in its pure state.

This year's Lion Meadow counselors were Amigo, Arrow, Bongo, Dodger, Ram, Ref, and Spuds. Alternating as program directors were Hermano, Shotgun, and Zorro.

During outcamp the Lioneers hiked steep mountains to visit places like Coyote Lakes, Silver Lakes, and Tower Rock above the Kern River. During fourth session the Lioneers added to Lion Meadow history as they hiked over 130 miles round-trip to the top of Mt. Whitney. At 14,496 ft. is it the highest peak in the continental United States.

Lion Meadows is the next possible step toward becoming a staff member at camp. Lion counselors recommend the best Lioneers to return for worker positions.

An elite program, Lion Meadows can only accomodate a small numbers of campers. Applications will be sent to those recommended by their counselors and to a select few who demonstrate by their letters to us at the office that they are ready for the experience. Out of all the applications only a special few are chosen to attend. Often those with the best chance to go are those of you who keep in touch by writing a letter to Rocky, Sarge, or Bravo to let us know how you are doing at school and at home. With the right attitude, you could be going to Lion next summer!




