
I learned to believe in myself. I learned that hard work and setting goals were the path to accomplish whatever I wanted to

Like many of us, growing up was very difficult for Fernando "Zorro James Ortiz. Migrating twice, from

Uruapan, Michoacan where he was born to Tijuana, B.C. and then from Tijuana to the City of Orange. Zorro had to learn to live between two cultures That of his family and

that of his school life. The struggle was to adapt his language, behavior, and eventually his thoughts to accommodate both cultures without compromising either.

"I have always regarded my family as my foundation," states Zorro who had come to realize that his parents struggled so much during their lives simply to give a better education and life for him and his other family members. Through family and financial struggles, his parents stood strong. "My parents' resolve and love of life have taught me the most important lessons in life; to be a good person, to love others, to be compassionate, to never deny who you are or where you come from," stated Zorro.

At 13, Zorro received the opportunity to attend Pyles Boys Camp. "I was overwhelmed with the experience and took advantage of everything there was," Zorro stated. "I vividly remember many things about the experience; the hike up Jerky, swimming at the pot holes, being cold at night, the campfire, cabin inspection, work detail and of course, Nana's cooking," he added.

Zorro was invited back to participate in the 2nd year program, Lion Meadows. He clearly remembers helping build the log cabin at Lion which is now used as a storage shed. For Zorro, Lion Meadows was a place of growing and learning about one self. He returned year after year and became a counselor, assistant director, and Lion Meadows director.







Worker "Pow Wow"
