Salute to Charles "Chisholm" Chrisman


who has made a significant contribution to our program. Board members, selectors, dedicated volunteers have all been highlighted. We have also highlighted seasonal staff who, because of


Keep the LESSONS you learned strong!



Take **PRIDE** in all that you do!






There were a variety of different events throughout the winter. Several BBQ fundraisers, camper weekend campouts, reunions, field trips to places such as the Santa Barbara Natural History


Cooking and Dining Cabin received major damage from a fallen tree.


we wish you the best!


Anew VIDERIES Experience



The Voyagers, learned much about mountaineering, leadership and each other. Most impor-







cepted into the Pyles Camp family. But, most importantly - they did a great job!





After watering and picketing my horse, and after much persuasion, I accepted.

They asked if I would like to spend the night as they had a ground plastic and an extra sleeping bag that no one would be using since it wouldn't stay zipped. I accepted after making sure that it really was extra.

GOLIATH SAID HE COULD RADIO OUT TO HIS BASE CAMP, SO I ASKED HIM TO ASK SOMEONE TO CONTACT MY BASE CAMP AND INFORM THEM THAT I ALL RIGHT AND WOULD SPEND THE NIGHT. THERE WERE SONGS AND TALES AROUND THE CAMPFIRE. ONE OF THE BOYS ASKED WHY THE HORSE KEPT WHINNYING AND I TOLD HIM I GUESS HE GETS LONESOME TOO.

THE NEXT MORNING, SHORTLY AFTER SIX, I WAS SADDLED AND READY TO GO. THE BOYS WERE STILL ASLEEP, BUT GOLIATH STOOD AND SHOOK MY HAND AND SAID HAVE A SAFE TRIP. I THANKED HIM FOR THE HOSPITALITY AND TOLD HIM HE HAD A GOOD BUNCH OF GUYS, THEY REALLY SAVED MY BACON.
