### Dedicated to Rifle

#### "A good life cannot be put in a few words."

The legacy of Pyles Camp has been the quality of its leaders. Mr. Pyles was dedicated to having the highest quality program. These philosophies lead to the recruiting of people such as **John "Rifle" Bethell**.

Rifle, a teacher in Taft, began his Pyles career by selecting boys. Eventually Smokey, the Camp Director, asked him to be his assistant during the summer. Upon Smokey's retirement in 1979, the Board of Directors hired Rifle as the full time Camp Director, a position he held until 1982. Smokey was high in praise for his replacement and remembered fondly the close association Rifle held with the Board and all the boys that went through camp. Nana remembers Rifle as a dear friend and one of the best Camp Directors she's worked with.

Rifle was best known for his big heart and desire to help boys. He would never close the door on anyone and believed that everyone was worth saving. Peanut remembered Rifle for his deep faith, wisdom, patience, kind and caring nature, and his humor.

#### Beaver shared the following story:

During the summer of 1976 my mother was in the hospital and my father came to the house to watch my younger bothers and sisters. Because of past experiences with my father this was not a good situation for me at all. Rifle found out about it and took me to live at his house for two weeks until I was scheduled to work at camp. While I was at his house he counseled me and helped me make it through a tough period in my life. Rifle did this out of the kindness of his heart and never asked anything in return.

I also remember Rifle playing the trumpet. He played "Taps" a couple of times from across the creek at campfire. I still remember lying down to sleep in the Marine Corps boot camp and in my mind hearing him play "Taps", and the sweet memories of Pyles Camp.

We will always remember his humor and Donald Duck impersonations at the campfire. He was quick to smile and slow to anger. Rifle made a positive impact in the lives of all that were fortunate enough to meet him.

Sadly, Rifle succumbed to the ravages of cancer this summer; he will be missed by all of us. May God bless his family and friends in our time of loss.

#### Rocky - Change


# Beaver - Dont let the chain of love end with you.

Time has passed by so fast, summer is gone and winter is here. It was a real joy to have each and every one of you at camp this summer. We shared many good times and shed a few tears together.



Anybody who has been through the Pyles Boys Camp program knows how hard it is to home and explain it all to their friends and loved ones. As the next step in the Pyles Boys Camp leaders development program, the boys who take on Lion Meadows grow and mature through challen

and experiences they will never forget.

Second session Lioneers experient the beauty of the Golden Trout Wilderness at Silver Lake, while also visiting Forester, Li Clair, and Franklin Lakes in the Sequoia National Park. Third session Lioneers proved they could go further than their desired Coy Lakes, all the way to Lioneer Lakes. They were amazed at the frogs, the fishing, and playing the snow. Fourth session Lioneers hold the record as the group that traveled the furthest summer, hiking all the way to the Big Five Lakes, in the shadow of Big Mount Kaweah.
