

One example of the big heart of Tex was how she would leave the kitchen after dinner and gather up all of the clothing needing mending (mostly blue jeans and pants) from the staff. Tex would take the clothes back to her cabin and work late into the night stitching up holes and sewing on patches. In the morning she would return the mended clothing, all done for just a hug. - Beaver


Thoughts from Beaver






Lion Meadows

reach the top. Whether or not you physically reach the top is irrelevent to your having tried your best to get there. So, enjoy the journey!





New Lioneer Cabin Under Construction

Over the last several years the program has been expanding at Pyles Camp. The Voyager Program which is for third year campers or selected staff for special trips has really taken off, going from one to two sessions a summer to four to five. The Lioneer Program has also been growing. We will be "double stacking" the Lion Meadows Program, meaning there will be two groups of Lioneers at the same time. One group heads to Lion Meadows while another group heads on their back packing trip, half way through the session the groups trade places.

One of the problems with the expansion of these two programs has been accommodating them while in main camp. The existing Lioneer cabin only sleeps sixteen people and the Voyagers have to sleep on the ground in the Kraft's area. To solve this problem construction has begun on a new Lioneer cabin. With funds that were raised through various grants and the support of **Bob Morton**, **Matt Owens** and their concrete and construction crew the new cabin will be completed by next summer. The new cabin will add thirty-two new sleeping spaces for the Lioneers and staff. The existing Lioneer cabin will become the Voyager cabin.
