"Babaluchi's" involvement with camp began in 1952 when he hosted a Christmas dinner for the Spartan Boys Club and Mr. Pyles attended through invitation from other acquaintances. They met and Mr. Pyles offered "Babaluchi" ten "camperships" for the next summer at Pyles Camp. Due to a large group of boys from the club, he decided, "the ones who

would profit most from going to camp were our ten worst-behaved kids."


Mr. Pyles was highly impressed with Eddie's work and offered him a job working for him in Huntington Beach. Working for Mr. Pyles was not your typical 9-5 job; you worked long hard hours in the oil fields. When you worked for Mr. Pyles you also volunteered your time to help build the camp. "Babaluchi" was fond of telling stories about Mr. Pyles, the time he spent at camp working on projects and working with the boys.

He spent many summer weekends driving boys from the Spartans Boys Club to and from Pyles Camp. For one summer he was a counselor, but mainly was a volunteer throughout his time with camp. In the good words of our dearest

"Smokey," he says, "he was a model selector...he adopted the boys camp and the boys camp adopted him."

"Babaluchi's" greatest attributes are clearly exemplified by what he did for others and who he was as a person. His most prized addition and one he must be thanked for as long as he's remembered was his introduction of another special person who has become the heart and soul of Pyles Boys Camp, our dearest "Nana." She recalls, "Babaluchi was interested in all the boys because like him, they lacked the guidance of someone who cared. Babaluchi took the challenge...when kids needed something, pair of shoes, pants, sweaters, anything, he made sure they got it." If there were kids in trouble and he could help, he'd be happy to go, "Do things in the kid's interest."

Eddie "Babaluchi" Calderon is to be honored and highly recognized by dedication of the Pylet for his hard, effortless, time consuming, dedicated work with young boys. We know at this time he sits in the heavens as an angel looking down upon the boys whose lives he touched. Dearly he will always be missed, admired, and idolized for his love and caring attitude towards needy boys.



The way you begin each and every day effects the future you have in your hands. If you start the day thinking only




When you start each day thinking and planning how that day and the days to follow will affect your plans for the future, you are seeing the big picture of the world just like looking out the window at the sky and horizon.


In our lives, we will confront a situation beyond our control. It will challenge us with an immense capacity passed

Being 12 miles from the main camp and 10 miles from the nearest road we rely on a very special and dedicated group of volunteers to help haul food and supplies to Lion Meadows as well as undertake building projects. What makes this group special is that they travel by horseback pulling strings of mules with all the supplies.

Reid Hopkins has been the main force behind these trips and projects. For more then 20 years he has been volunteering his time, livestock, talents and ability to round up the right people for the job. In recent years Jack McGee, Dick Rivers and members of the Big Bear Posse, just to name a few, have become familiar faces on these trips.

At the end of this summer they headed to Lion Meadows to build a much needed food storage cabin to replace an old storage cabin that was falling down. Last year they built a new outhouse.

We would like to thank all of you who over the years have helped keep Lion Meadows stocked with supplies.





2004 Mule Days Team

Who would have thought that nearly ten years ago, a tradition was about to begin that would impact the lives of so many people. From the love of one man for livestock and belief and dedication for R.M. Pyles Boys Camp the "Pyles Boys Camp Mule Days Team" was created. Each year 10 Pyles boys are selected to compete in this program. To be selected one must possess leadership potential, have a love or at least an interest in livestock, be able to represent Pyles in a positive manner and, most importantly, be a person that could really benefit from the program. Since that time many Pyles boys have participated in this event which begins in January each year with learning basic horsemanship knowledge and handson skills and ends up in May with competing at the "Bishop Mule Days" which is the largest Mule Show in the world.

During the 5 months of training and preparation the boys are taught how to saddle and ride horses and mules, how to pack mules, and they practice the many events that they will be competing in. These boys also become CPR certified and are trained for helicopter safety. They receive a "Leave No Trace" certificate from the Bureau of Land Management which is earned after learning proper techniques for packing and camping in the wilderness. The boys also learn health and medical aspects of livestock from proper nutrition to treating illness and injuries. The practices take place every other weekend in Kernville at the home of Reid and Eileen Hopkins.

Over the years there have been many people involved in the program for one reason or another either because of their love for horses and mules or their love for Pyles Camp or both. The donation of money, equipment, supplies and personal time and effort have made the Pyles Mule Days Team experience possible. Each year the boys receive more and more recognition



at Mule Days. Three years ago the team received new packing equipment from the Mule Days announcers and other committee members, two years ago new riding saddles were donated and last year a participant donated two matched mules and equipment for the boys too compete with. Also, many vendors donated left over clothes, tack and other items which did not sell over the weekend.

Pyles was also asked to give a special presentation this year during the Saturday night performance on the use of an Aparejo pack saddle, which was used during the Civil War. R.M. Pyles Boys Camp has really made a name for itself at the annual Bishop Mule Days. Each year the boys come home with numerous ribbons and trophies for their efforts. The volunteers as well as the competing boys are truly blessed each year from being able to participate and share this experience together.

Thank you to all of you! We could not do it without your help, dedication, skills and knowledge that each of you bring.




























