This years "Pylet" is dedicated to Mr. Win Payne, a long time family member of R.M. Pyles Boys Camp and founder of the College Scholarship Program. Mr. Payne passed-on early this year on February 3rd, 2005 and we will all miss his influence.

Mr. Win Payne was born in Greenfield, Massachusetts. At the age six, he and his family then moved to Long Beach, California where he attended elementary and middle school and graduated from Long Beach Poly High School in 1936. He continued his education he attended Compton Jr. College. After earning his A.A. degree he completed his education at one of the most prestigious schools in the country, the University of Southern California (USC) and earned a degree in Petroleum Engineering, graduating with the Class of 1940.

He obtained his first job from Richfield Oil Company located in Long Beach (known today as Atlantic Richfield Oil Company). He only worked six months for that company. He was transferred to Kern County where he worked the oil fields in the city of Taft as an engineer/petroleum geologist and was on call day-or-night. The office was then moved to Bakersfield and a second transfer was made. He remained employed there until 1948.

Win would be transferred yet a third time to Richfield Oil Company where he remained until 1956 and decided to work as an independent oil consultant. He drilled oil for himself and leased land in Willows, California where

he drilled gas wells. He formed a small company "Fran-Win Oil & Gas Company" named after he and his wife (Fran) where they resided in both Long Beach and Huntington Beach. After the company was established in 1967 he and his wife moved to Hawaii.

Members of the oil industry first introduced *Win* to Pyles Boys Camp in 1975. While making numerous visits, meeting staff, and talking to them at main camp he recognized that many of the boys had the desire to attend college and "he wanted to help" (Fran Payne). In 1977, *Win* made the proposal to the former and the new board presidents *Mo Benson* and *Phil Kistler* to create a scholarship fund. His proposal was accepted and a Special Youth Activities Committee was composed to determine the objectives of the fund for formal proposal to the board. *Chet Frazier* became the chairmen and was assisted by *Don Craggs*, *Phil Kistler*, *Ed Pellegrin*, "*Smokey*," and "*Rifle*" who defined the objective essentials for the scholarship program which have continued to be in effect today. The college scholarship program assists qualified camper/staff candidates with financial need, who deserve the opportunity and demonstrate the ability to succeed, and also have a positive outlook towards life who have been earning their way through college.

To show their love, care, and helpful attitude *Win and Fran* made the first contribution to the fund. Since then they've continued to be an important financial and moral supporter's of the college scholarship program.

On behalf of all scholarship recipients we want to thank you from the bottom of our hearts with tremendous gratitude for your contributions to our educational success and our past, present, and future careers. We have tried to make you proud and we honor you for your dedication to our lives. Win, we hope you sit in the heavens looking down upon us with a fulfilled heart as you have done so much for so many young men through your involvement at R.M. Pyles Boys Camp!
