

To Smokey we give our thanks for his many years of giving and shaping the organization we know as R.M. Pyles Boys Camp. Thank you Smokey for all you have done.




Choose Your Path

50 Years of Meals - Thank You Nana


For the past 50 years one of the most talked about things at camp has been how good the food is. Mr. Pyles believed that it was important to serve healthy family style meals.



In 1958 Nana was working for a school district in the food services department, when a friend that worked with Mr. Pyles asked her if she would like to come to Pyles Camp to cook for








Welcome to Leslie McCann

Pyles Leadership Training

This year during second session we had a group of seven for Pyles Leadership Training (PLT's). This is another step in advancing through Pyles Camp. After being a Camper, Lioneer, Voyager, Worker and Specialist these young men are at the age of 18 and ready to become counselors. We also have PLT's that have not advanced through the years with the Pyles Camp Program. We are very fortunate to get two interns from the University of Notre Dame each year. We also take recommendations from other staff members for potential PLT's. This year the seven who completed PLT's consisted of *Froggy, Juggernaut, Vertigo, Gator, Penguin, Python and Radio*. It takes a lot of hard work and dedication to complete the course. We are very proud of our counselors for completing the course and their commitment to the Pyles Camp Program.

We started off the session with *Sidewinder* and *Beaver* as the instructors with *Coach* attending the 1st evening. Coach had been the Lead Instructor in past years as well as the main person in developing the course. Beaver as the Camp Director soon had other responsibilities to attend to; *McFly* was able to step in to finish the 2nd half of the session. This was a very beneficial mix of instructors. The four instructors for the PLT's have over 100 years of combined experience with Pyles Boys Camp.

The PLT program consists of a full session of classroom, practical, and observing other counselors with their groups. The PLT's also go on an Outcamp and have the opportunity to deal with different scenarios that may arise when they become counselors.




