

Make us proud, but better, make yourself proud of your success.





# Lion Meadows

Congratulations to ALL of this years Lioneers! During your session you got to see and experience things you may have never done before. You may have hiked to some awesome lakes, experienced nature while huddled under a tarp during a summer rain storm, or helped to clean up Lion Meadows. But most of all, each of you accepted the challenge of the Lion Meadows program and learned more about yourself and your potential.

Lion Meadows is a very different experience from main camp. There are no specialist, no electricity, and no cook (How will we survive!). What we do have is a beautiful alpine meadow with a stream running down the middle of it, a rustic cook cabin and shelters. Most importantly we have each other. We learn to work together, cook on a wood-burning stove, participate in new and exciting activities, and pull together as a team. Lioneers spend more time in the wilderness and go further then any main camp group. They experience all the wonders of nature, from making snow cones and having snow ball fights in early summer snow fields to fishing in lakes over 10,000 feet in elevation. It is a rugged and physical experience but you will be glad you took the challenge.



This year Gallo and myself were privileged enough to lead a group of leaders through the Golden Trout Wilderness. At first nobody knew what we were in store for. However, after spending a few days working together in the backcountry, we all grew a little closer. I challenged each one of these young men to make a difference this summer. We asked them to push themselves to their limits, to work together as a team, and to think about ways they could change once they got home. Although this was a challenging request, not a single person returned home as they came. I am proud of this year's 4th session Voyagers because they all pushed themselves to be better people, but more importantly, because they never gave up along the way.

## Pyles Leadership Training

Developing Pyles Camp's future leaders

Pyles Leadership Training is designed to prepare a select group of young men for the challenging, enjoyable, and demanding job of counselor. Being selected to become a counselor is not guaranteed, but rather the selections are made on the basis of their work ethic, desire and enthusiasm.

Counselors are the backbone of Pyles Camp, and the campers' safety and camp experience are entrusted to these young men. It is important to fully develop the *leadership*, *supervision*, *decision making*, *and safety* skills in these young men to insure that they are prepared to provide the most enjoyable and rewarding experience for the campers. The focus of the PLT Program is to fully develop these skills in each of the participants.

The PLT program is a full session of hard work filled with lectures, group discussions, practical exercises and observations of experienced counselors at work with their groups in order to prepare these young men for the tremendous challenges of the position. The PLT's also go on an outcamp where they have the opportunity to deal with different scenarios that may arise when they become counselors.

The facilitators/instructors for the training were *Coach, Sidewinder, and Cloud*. Coach has been the lead instructor for 14 years, as well as, the main person responsible for the course development. Sidewinder has been the Camp Outreach Coordinator, and Cloud has been with the camp for many years, most recently as the Lion Meadows Director.

# The Tree Monkeys Return to Lion Meadow

We express extreme gratitude to the Bear Valley tree service, specifically owner Josh and his employees Collin, Harry and Willy for their hard work at Lion Meadow and Main Camp. This is the second year they have worked with us to clean up Lion Meadow and make it a safer, cleaner, and more naturally beautiful place. They

also brought a chipper with them to the spring work party and supported our efforts in hazard reduction at our Main Camp.



In the fall, with the support of Maverick, Billy Bear, Chisholm, and McFly, they were able to accomplish more work in five days than most would be willing to do in ten. Without their help we could not afford to do what needs to be done at Lion Meadow. We have several more years of hazard reduction and clean up work left at main camp and Lion Meadow and they have already told us they believe in what Pyles Camp is doing and will continue to return to do what they can to help us accomplish our goals.

# Alumni Return to Camp to Remember: Robert "Smokey" McAdams

On the weekend of the 18th – 20th of September 2009 the Pyles Alumni Committee held a dedication/ remembrance ceremony in honor of Robert "Smokey" McAdams in the campfire area of the R.M. Saturday afternoon we met at the campfire area for the unveiling of the plaque, and the dedication of the campfire area to Smokey.

During the dedication Beaver told the story of how a young Bob Pyles came from Texas to California, and how he ended up in the oil patch. Beaver also shared how Bob McAdams was roped into being the director for the camp, and how Smokey was able to crystallize the vision set forth by Mr. Pyles into the program which has touched us all.

Many there gave a personal testimony of how Smokey influenced their lives. I think it is fair to say all of us realized because of Smokey's influence, our lives have enjoyed more success and fulfillment than we would have had we not meet this man. For many there the roots of who we are have their origins in the seeds Smokey planted in each of us.


how to use a bow and arrow. I saw some of you overcoming your fears by going up the ropes course and others conquering insecurities by getting on top of a horse for the first time. It was a special moment for me to be able to walk around the camp and reflect on how much this camp brings out our best potential. It was

at that moment that I realized that Pyles Camp is a very special place. My hope and my desire is that you will also reflect on your camp experience and think about a moment in which you learned something special about yourself.

Right now things might be going great for you in the city or things might be difficult. The one thing I know about life is that it brings challenges. There are moments in which I feel sad and it's hard to see the positive things in life. But it's at that moment when I turn to God and I remember Pyles Camp and I realize that any obstacle can be overcome. I want to leave you

with this quote since circumstances will constantly change. "What happens to a man is less significant than what happens within him".
