

When Henry David Thoreau left his home in the city to live in the woods near Walden Pond in order to protest slavery, he discovered something that changed his life. While there he learned that hard work and simple living were the keys to happiness. He came to believe that building something with your own hands is the greatest thing a man can do. This quote sums up the lessons he learned, and I believe it is important for all of you who have experienced Pyles Camp. What Thoreau is saying is that if you have dreams, goals, or ambitions, you must always seek to achieve them. Always be moving forward "confidently in the direction of [your] dreams" and you will be met with success. When you keep this as the simple motivation for your life, you will begin to realize that your failures aren't truly failures. Do not let yourself be turned away from your goals or your dreams because they are difficult to achieve, or because you might have been met with a failure or two (or maybe more) along the way. Not only that, don't ever stop moving forward, growing, changing, and becoming better. Pyles Camp always endeavors to give you the tools and the motivation to do what Thoreau challenges; to recognize the benefit of getting away from the complexities of life and to live simply. And in those moments of simplicity at Gray Meadow, or Lion, or somewhere in the middle of the wilderness on the Pacific Crest Trail, you will find the clarity and the strength to continue reaching for your goals. If you have built "castles in the sky" you have to "put the foundations under them." Build those dreams. But also remember that the biggest castle is nothing without a strong foundation. Dream big, but always work to make those dreams a reality.




5th Session Voyagers "You Hold Your Future"

Pyles Leadership Training Developing Pyles Camp's Future Leaders

Pyles Leadership Training is the first step in becoming a counselor at camp, and every year a special group of young men are identified and selected to participate in this very intense and demanding training that challenges them to be the best. PLT training is no "walk in the park" due to the importance of the counselor's role and the tremendous responsibility placed upon them. It is a full session of hard work filled with lecture, group discussions, practical exercises and observations of experienced counselors at work with their groups, as well as, an outcamp experience that allows them to practice the skills they learned in order to prepare them for the difficult, enjoyable and rewarding position of counselor.

Becoming a counselor is not a "right of passage" or guaranteed, and each participant has to earn his place in the program. The selections are made on the basis of their attitude, strong work ethic, desire and enthusiasm.

Counselors are the backbone of Pyles Camp, and the campers' safety and camp experience are entrusted to these young men. It is important to fully develop the *leadership*, *supervision*, *decision making*, *and safety* skills in these young men to insure that they are prepared to provide the most enjoyable and rewarding experience for the campers. The focus of the PLT Program is to fully develop these skills in each of the participants, and provide them with the tools to perform at the highest level.








Winter Outreach The Pyles Adventure Continues On
