This years Pylet is dedicated to Lois “Swede” McAdams

Lois Betty Wisham (“Swede”) was born April 14th, 1925 in Long Beach Ca. to George and Betty Wisham. While serving as a Naval Secretary in San Diego in 1941, she met and married Bob “Smokey” McAdams, who was serving as a Navy Shipman, also stationed in San Diego.

They both survived the war and started the hard work of beginning a career and family. Smokey was discovered and hired by Mr. Pyles to help develop and establish R. M. Pyles Boys Camp. In 1956, with two small children under 2 in tow, Swede followed Smokey on horseback into Lloyd Meadow Basin. Undeterred by the remoteness or the challenges presented in raising small children in the wilderness, Swede spent the summers watching their children, helping in the kitchen and supporting her husband. Swede was a steadfast and undeterred woman who would not let minor discomforts separate her family. While at camp, Swede quickly began to see the young men there as an extension of her family and would nurture each camper, worker and staff member. Swede quickly became a fixture at camp and a welcoming sight to many who were missing their mothers back home.

When Pyles Camp moved the corporate headquarters to a new location on Huntington Beach in 1963, the McAdams family followed. While continuing to support Smokey and camp,

Lois became a beloved employee of the Huntington Beach School District, retiring from there after 25 years as the Executive Secretary to the District Superintendent.

After Smokey’s death in 2008, Lois moved to Colorado with her daughter Lynda (“Lulu”) where she lived a happy and comfortable life until her passing September 30th, 2016.

Pyles Leadership Training

This year during second session we had a group of 11 for Pyles Leadership Training (PLT'S). This is another step in advancing through Pyles Camp. After being a Camper, Lioneer, Voyager, Worker and Specialist these young men are at the age of 18 and ready to become counselors. This year the 11 who completed PLT's consisted of *Matrix, Stone, Red, Grizzly, Rubio, Yamaha, Reverend, King, Simba, Kusuku, and Felix*. It takes a lot of hard work and dedication to complete the course. We are very proud of our counselors for completing the course and their commitment to the Pyles Camp program.

Our instructors this year were *Hondo, Gizmo and Flame*. Gizmo works as a full-time school psychologist and part-time university professor in San Diego, CA. At camp, he has previously worked as a worker, counselor, worker coach, assistant director, Lion Meadows director, and Voyager director. Hondo is a sergeant with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. He currently is in charge of the Explorer Program. He has previously worked as a PLT instructor, camp counselor, worker, and has been a selector of campers for over 20 years. Flame is the District Recruiter for H&M and is currently overseeing the Global Flagship Store in Las Vegas, NV. At camp, he has previously worked as a worker, counselor, worker coach and Voyager Director. This was a very beneficial mix of instructors.

The PLT program consists of a full session of classroom, practical and observing other counselors with their groups.
