





Stinging Nettle is a plant that is common in the Camp area. It is easily recognized by its gray-green, toothed leaves, fuzzy-looking stems, and greenish flower clusters. It grows to 6 feet tall or more, in moist areas. The "hairs" can cause a painful sting, which is only temporary. If thoroughly boiled, this plant can be eaten and is high in some vitamins.



LION MEADOWS



Lion Meadows is a 120 acre parcel of land in the middle of the Golden Trout Wilderness area, belonging to Pyles Boys Camp and used as a special place

for a second-year experience for some Campers. To be selected for the Lion Meadows experience, a Camper must have done well enough in his first year group at the Main Camp to have obtained the recommendation of his counselor. Then he may receive an application in the mail the following winter. About 200 such applications will be sent out this year, but there is only room for 60 Lioneers each summer! After all the applications are returned, Colonel and the Lion Meadows Director will go over all of them, and determine who they will invite to be Lioneers, or alternates in case a first choice cannot make it for some reason. To receive an invitation to attend Lion Meadows is truly an honor!

In 1983, our Lion Meadows Director was Sarge (left), who enjoyed a great summer there in the back country. Living in Lion Meadows means taking care of all your own chores, such as cooking on the wood stove and maintaining the Camp. You sleep under the stars at night, drink right from the clear waters of the stream, work, play and learn


in the sunshine. Lioneers who show exceptional potential are often invited to come back to the Main Camp to be a worker on the staff.

There are also work projects to be done, such as those that were done this summer: building a log cabin, using old-time tools and methods; setting up a flagpole; building a new chapel; repairing fences and a bridge; making wood furniture and clearing trails.

It can be a lot of work, but very satisfying to those who go to Lion Meadows. And those people are, after all, very special people indeed!


