LION MEADOWS

Lion Meadows is an opportunity for a few selected campers to have a second chance at a Pyles Camp experience. Lion is a few rustic cabins, a wood burning stove, and a beautiful meadow deep in the Golden Trout Wilderness. Lioneers learn to depend on each other, to work together, and to share the Pyles Camp experience on a higher level. It takes work to get there, but is worth the effort! There is a chance to hike to high alpine lakes, play on mountain glaciers, and to experience nature in its wilderness beauty. You will sleep under the stars, bathe in the clear mountain stream, and grow into more of the potential you discovered as a Pyles camper.

Lion Meadows is the next possible step toward becoming a staff member at camp. Lion counselors recommend the best Lioneers to return for worker positions.

This year's Lion Meadow counselors were Amigo, Arrow, Blaster, Bojangles, Coach, Dodger, Panther, Reckless, Ref, and Spuds. Alternating as program directors were Hermano, Shotgun, and Zorro.

Lion Meadows is an specialized program. We can only accept a small numbers of campers. Applications will be sent in January to those recommended by their counselors and to a select few who demonstrate by their letters to us at the office that they are ready for the experience. Out of all the applications only the few best are chosen to attend. The best chances usually to go are those of you who keep in touch by writing a letter to Bravo to let us know how you are doing at school and at home. With the right attitude, you could be going to Lion next summer!






LION MEADOWS WORK PARTY



This last summer, during sixth session, Lion Meadows underwent a reconstruction project. The venerable cook's cabin was in need of some rafter replacement and general major maintenance. The problem was to make the structure safe and strong, but keep the rustic atmosphere. Our answer came in the generous work offered by Doug Meller, Reid Hopkins, "Chislom", and a crew of family and friends. Chislom added to the foundation during the previous session. Then the whole crew dismantled the old cabin and built up the new walls shown here from trees cut from Lion Meadows. Doug's expert skills have given us a cabin that could last one hundred years. They will go in early next summer to add rafters and a new tin roof to complete the job.

In the photos here you can see the old cabin, followed by the process required to cut each tree into the proper knotched form. Each log needed more than six people to carry it into place. Campers from Enoch's group helped during outcamp. The Lioneers provided invaluable help to get the job to this stage.













