




Every Journey Begins With The First Step



To ALL the volunteers, we can't say it enough, THANK YOU!






















Our hope is that the camp connection will provide a spring board for you to advance to the future in all the best ways possible.




Backcountry Emergency Care

"Band Aid!" Once again we were fortunate to have *John "Bugeye" Papastathis* join us at camp during the pre-camp training session to lead us through a backcountry first aid class. Bugeye has been associated with Pyles Camp for nearly twenty years now training most of our counselor and specialists in the finer art of Backcountry Emergency Care and as a staff member. Due to the location of the camp and the remote areas we venture into in the mountains, we become 911 until any assistance arrives, which could be anywhere from an hour to a day away.

The specialized training is vital to the safety of everyone in the backcountry. This is a three day, 22 hour, intense class. Providing the staff with a mix of lectures and lots of hands on practice, involving almost every possible incident that may arise while in the mountains. Though the class is intense, there never seems to be an end to Bugeye's patience to provide an individual or the whole group extra assistance on the more difficult situations.

This training has been a great asset to the development of the staff over the years. We are proud to say that many of the skills we have learned have yet to be used, except for one: the confidence that each of the staff has in themselves to handle difficult situations.

Lion Meadows

Congratulations to ALL of this years Lioneers! During your session you got to see and experience things you may have never done before. You may have hiked to some awesome lakes, experienced nature while huddled under a tarp during a summer rain storm, and helped improve Lion Meadows. But most of all, each of you accepted the challenge of the Lion Meadows program and learned more about yourself and your potential.

Lion Meadows is a very different experience from main camp. There are no specialist, no electricity, and no cook. What we do have is a beautiful alpine meadow with a stream running down the middle of it, a rustic cook cabin and shelters. Most important we have each other. We learn to work together, cook on a wood-burning stove, participate in new and exciting activities, and pull together as a team. Lioneers spend more time in the wilderness and go further then any main camp group. They experience all the wonders of nature, from making snow cones and having snow ball fights in early summer snow fields to fishing in lakes over 10,000 feet in elevation. It is a rugged and physical experience but you will be glad you took the challenge.

Pyles Leadership Training

Developing Pyles Camp's future leaders

Pyles Leadership Training is designed to prepare a select group of young men for the challenging, enjoyable, and demanding job of counselor. Being selected to the PLT Program is not guaranteed, but rather on the basis of their work ethic, desire and enthusiasm.

Counselors are the backbone of Pyles Camp, and the campers' safety and camp experience are entrusted to these young men. It is important to fully develop the *leadership*, *supervision*, *decision making*, *and safety* skills

in these young men to insure that they are prepared to provide the most enjoyable and rewarding experience for the campers. The focus of the PLT Program is to fully develop these skills in each of the participants.

The PLT program is a full session of hard work filled with lectures, group discussions, practical exercises and observations of experienced counselors at work with their groups in order to prepare these young men for the tremendous challenges of the position. The PLT's also go on an outcamp where they have the opportunity to deal with different scenarios that may arise when they become counselors.

The facilitators/instructors for the training were *Coach*, *Hondo*, *and Cloud*. Coach has been the lead instructor for 15 years, as well as, the main person responsible for the course development. Hondo is an alumni of the camp, he is also a selector and works for the LA County Sheriff's Department. Cloud has been with the camp for many years, most recently as the Lion Meadows Director.

Lion Meadow Project

Located deep in the Golden Trout Wilderness ten miles away from the nearest road and nestled at the base of the Great Western Divide lies 120 acres of pristine wilderness. A large lush meadow is surrounded by tall green trees and skirted by a flowing creek. Above you sits the "Top of the World", below you runs the Little Kern River and off in the distance you can see Maggie Mountain and Farwell Gap. This great piece of property is Lion Meadows.

Lion Meadows was purchased in the mid 1970's to expand our main camp program. It provided a second location and the opportunity for those campers wishing to come back to camp and have a whole different experience building on the lessons they learned. Within Lion Meadows there are three cabins, two storage sheds and a kitchen. Anyone who has spent time at Lion Meadows knows just how special this place is, and the more time you spend out there the feeling gets even stronger.

As with any property or facility there is a time when maintenance and repairs are needed and Lion Meadows was in need. This past summer thanks in part to the Hartley Foundation we were able to begin many of the much needed repairs and upgrades. Some of the projects include: replacing the fence, remolding the cabins, replacing the solar system, installing a corral, replacing old furniture and thinning and trimming of trees for fire safety and a healthier forest.

We would like to extend our thanks to all of those who have taken part in all the work that has been done at Lion Meadows.
