In 1959, Pyles Camp acquired a 2-year-old mule and named him Toby. From the beginning there was something, special about Toby. In those days there were no roads into Camp, and all supplies and materials had to be brought in on the backs of men, horses and mules. Toby did his share of that work, and more. As the most gentle and sure-footed of the mules, he soon became the favorite of all

When he died, he was buried on the hillside overlooking the Camp he loved. A monument was built on the gravesite, and a special memorial service was held during sixth session. 
